The **OACC** program provides many benefits to both the council and camp, and the position is a prerequisite for those lodges/councils interested in participating in the **‘Get Kids to Camp Partnership’**. In addition, the **OACC** is also a mandatory requirement for those lodges seeking to earn the Southern Region’s **‘We Support Camping Award’**.
